

DSCSA


- Title II of Drug Quality and Security Act

 - Many questions and issues to resolve




The Supply from Cradle to Grave



- Introduction point for counterfeit or substandard drugs
- Increased risk is directly proportional to the increased number of transactions, requiring greater due diligence by wholesalers
- Safest drug supply has the fewest movements from manufacturer to patient



Understanding the Threat

May 2015- \$400 Million

May 7, 2015: Three California Men and Minnesota Corporation Indicted in Nationwide Prescription Drug Diversion Scheme

Throughout the course of the conspiracy charged in the indictment, using these fraudulent pedigree documents, Miller and MIC sold approximately \$393 million worth of prescription drugs to wholesalers and retail pharmacies throughout the United States, including to multiple customers in the Southern District of Ohio.

April 29, 2016: Manhattan U.S. Attorney Announces Arrest Of Black Market Distributor Of Diverted HIV Medications Worth Approximately \$4 Million

From at least in or about September 2013 until April 2016, DELEONROSA was part of a black market distribution network that distributed bulk quantities of second-hand HIV prescription drugs to unsuspecting consumers. In particular, the members of the black market distribution ring would initially obtain the HIV prescription drugs by purchasing these drugs from patients to whom these medications were originally prescribed. The prescription HIV bottles were then collected and the labels (containing the patients' names) were removed using dangerous substances, including lighter fluid and other potentially hazardous chemicals. Through this process, the members of the black market distribution network made the bottles appear new in order to conceal the fact that the bottles had previously been dispensed to patients. This process allowed the bottles eventually to be re-sold to pharmacies and unsuspecting consumers. Consumers who eventually received these second-hand prescription HIV medications were not aware that the prescription bottles had been previously sold, treated with potentially hazardous chemicals, and possibly not stored under conditions sufficient to maintain their medical efficacy.



What's Being Observed

Drugs with Pharmacy label are cleaned with Lighter fluid or goo gone and move back through wholesalers and pharmacies.




Transaction History Validation Scenario 1



<u>Black Lines</u>- Purported Product Flow <u>Red Lines</u>- Diverted Product Flow





July 2012 Congressional Drug Shortages Report

In the drug chain illustrated below, which documents the shipment of 25 vials of a chemotherapy drug called fluorouracil in September 2011, the leakage point was a Maryland pharmacy called Priority Healthcare. Instead of dispensing the drug to patients, the owner of this company, Marianna Pesti, sold the vials to a New Jersey distributor called Tri-Med America, which was owned by Ms. Pesti's husband, Gabor Szilagyi. The drugs were sold five more times before reaching their end user, a hospital in California.

Drug Distribution – Critical Safety and Effectiveness Points

- Storage, Handling, Shipment Most drugs require storage between 68 – 77 F.
- Refrigeration critical for biologicals
- Freezing can deactivate vaccines
- Sources Must be a strong emphasis on Legitimacy of Rx drug supply to prevent sub-standard, adulterated, or counterfeit drugs

Secondary Wholesalers

- Multiple WDs in History
- Falsifying Histories (First WD like Cardinal is False)
- Buying as a pharmacy, selling as a WD
- Affiliate transfers
